

**RESOLUTION NO. 3291-16**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WINDSOR  
DECLARING THE END OF THE WATER SHORTAGE EMERGENCY CONDITION  
WITHIN THE SERVICE AREA OF THE WINDSOR WATER DISTRICT**

**WHEREAS**, on July 15, 2014, the State Water Board adopted Article 22.5 entitled “Drought Emergency Water Conservation Regulations” (California Code of Regulations, Title 23, sections 863, 864, and 865) which makes drought related findings and imposes mandatory requirements on urban water suppliers state-wide; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 6, 2014, the Town Council adopted Resolution 3118-14 declaring a Stage 2 water shortage emergency, with an overall mandatory rationing requirement of 20 percent, and declaring certain water uses to be non-essential, all as specified in Section 12-3-800 *et seq.* of the Town of Windsor Municipal Code; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 17, 2015 the State Water Board amended and re-adopted the Drought Emergency Water Conservation Regulations; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 6, 2015 the Board adopted Resolution 3197-15, implementing additional Stage 2 drought restrictions mandated by the State Water Board on urban suppliers; and

**WHEREAS**, on February 2, 2016 the State Water Board extended the Drought Emergency Water Conservation Regulations to October 2016; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 18, 2016, the State Water Board adopted amended Drought Emergency Water Conservation Regulations, recognizing differing water supply conditions throughout the state and including new requirements for urban retail water suppliers and their wholesale water providers to conduct a three-year water supply reliability assessment using State-specified assumptions for water demand and supply; and

**WHEREAS**, the result of the water supply reliability assessment was to be used to calculate and report to the State Water Board a revised urban water supplier conservation target for the period from June 1, 2016 to the end of January 2017; and

**WHEREAS**, the Windsor Water District (District) is a retail water purveyor and the Sonoma County Water Agency (Agency) is the District’s wholesale contractor; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 19, 2016, the Agency completed a three-year water supply reliability assessment consistent with the requirements of the State Water Board’s adopted Drought Emergency Water Conservation Regulations, and the results demonstrated to the satisfaction of District staff that the District’s calculated conservation target was zero percent; and

**WHEREAS**, the Agency is reporting that Lakes Sonoma and Mendocino are currently nearly full and water year conditions on the Russian River are normal.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Town Council of the Town of Windsor does hereby find, determine and declare that, in accordance with Section 12-3-810 of the Town of Windsor Municipal Code, the water shortage emergency condition declared on August 6, 2014, has ended.
